Overview

This Privacy Policy outlines how I handle personal information collected through my Contact Form. I do not use tracking cookies, analytics services, or behavioral trackers on this website. I do not share your information with third-parties.

Information That Is Collected

The only information that is collected is the personal information that you voluntarily submit through the Contact Form, which may include:

Name

Email Address

Message content

Standard technical server metadata (IP address and timestamp) collected automatically by my hosting platform for security and operational integrity.

Lawful Basis and Purpose of Processing (GDPR)

Your personal information is processed under the following legal bases:

Legitimate Interests (GDPR Art. 6(1)(f)): To review, manage, and respond to inquiries, requests, or messages submitted through the form.

Data Retention

Your contact form submissions are retained only for as long as necessary to fulfill the purpose of your inquiry or to comply with statutory legal and record-keeping obligations.

Personal information is stored in secure web hosting and email servers located in the United States.

"Do Not Sell or Share" Disclosure (CCPA/CPRA)

I do not sell your personal information, nor do I share your personal information with third parties for cross-context behavioral advertising or marketing purposes.

Your Privacy Rights

Depending on your jurisdiction, you have specific rights regarding your personal data:

EU/EEA & UK Residents (GDPR):

- Right of access (Art. 15 GDPR): You have the right to request access to the personal information we hold about you and to obtain information about how we process it.
- Right to rectification (Art. 16 GDPR): If you believe that any personal information we hold about you is incorrect or incomplete, you have the right to request its correction or completion.
- Right to erasure ('right to be forgotten') (Art. 17 GDPR): You have the right to request the deletion of your personal information when it is no longer necessary for the purposes for which it was collected, among other circumstances.
- Right to restriction of processing (Art. 18 GDPR): You have the right to request that we restrict the processing of your personal information under certain conditions.
- Right to data portability (Art. 20 GDPR): You have the right to receive your personal information in a structured, commonly used, and machine-readable format and to transmit those data to another controller.
- Right to object (Art. 21 GDPR): You have the right to object to the processing of your personal information, under certain conditions, including processing for direct marketing.
- Right to withdraw consent (Art. 7(3) GDPR): Where the processing of your personal information is based on your consent, you have the right to withdraw that consent at

any time without affecting the lawfulness of processing based on consent before its withdrawal.

- Right to lodge a complaint (Art. 77 GDPR): You have the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority if you believe our processing of your personal information violates applicable data protection laws.

California Residents (CCPA/CPRA):

- Right to Know: Request details about the categories and specific pieces of personal information collected.
- Right to Delete: Request the deletion of personal information collected from you.
- Right to Correct: Request corrections to inaccurate personal information.
- Non-Discrimination: You will not receive discriminatory treatment for exercising any of your CCPA rights.
